6. Symptoms during this period : kept head back or I would have gon [gone] to -

7. Operation: *leg flap [?] arm circular*

8. Symptoms following operation – shock? *felt pretty* [?]

duration of, if known? a day or 2

hemorrhage? arm concederable [considerable] leg mor [more]

Pain – character? of course it hurts

extent?

seat? in the stumps

severity? (This answer as fully as possible.) *I was wounded through knee cap* & joint and elbow joint and for arm [forearm] both by minnie balls

Suppuration – extent? Arm heald [healed] in 19 days

duration? *leg took longer*

recurrence? never had any trouble with either stumps after once healed.

Healing, when complete? Arm in 19 days, leg longer on [?] parts of bone had to be discharged first!

When was artificial limb first worn? *never wore any on arm, stump too short leg has been worn constantly since July 1864*

9. Has the loss of your member altered the general health? I enjoy good health can not say that loss of limbs made any changes in health

Have there been any alterations of pulse? *do not know*

body temperature? *none keept [kept] [?]*

digestion? yes my digestion is not as perfect as formerly that is certain articles do not agree with me as formerly

intellectual powers? no.

disposition? quick temperer [temper]

or habits? pretty regular, eat and drink as my appetite dictates avoiding such as I know does not agree. [?] pickels [pickles] bananas - pork [?]

Has there been any change in the acuteness of the special sense, i. e., hearing, sight, sense of taste? *not to my knowledge*

What reasons have you for ascribing such alterations, if any are noted, to the injury or operation? **no**

Is there any alteration in the amount of sleep or of solid or liquid nourishment required? *yes I think I require more sleep than formerly*

Was the amputation followed by any marked change in your ability for mental or bodily exertion? *no. bodily of course to some extent*

10. Record any increase in strength and size of remaining limbs if such has been noticed. I think both remaining limbs are rather stronger than formerly but do not think changed in size much

Has the ability to use the remaining part been increased? *yes in so far as making more different use of some*

- 11. Does the skin of the stump differ from the rest of the body?
 - (1) As to texture? **no**
 - (2) Color? *no*
 - (3) Temperature? *leg rather warmer being constantly incased in artificial leg*
 - (4) Growth of hair? no

Does it sweat more of less than other surfaces of the body? **yes. since the leg stump is incased**

Is it more sensitive than other surfaces of the body as to pain; for instance, the prick of a pin? **yes a little**

How extensive is the area of altered sensation?

Is it more sensitive than other surfaces of the body to touch? a little

How far does the altered sensation extend? *mainly only in front of bone*

Does a touch give a sensation of pain? no

Is there excessive sensibility to extremes of heat and cold? no

- (a) When applied to the part, as hot or cold water? *not more than other parts*
- (b) When dependent upon general changes in the temperature of the atmosphere, as in summer and winter? *not particularly*
- (c) Is there excessive sensibility to changes in the weather, as at the approach of a storm or during the prevalence of certain winds? **yes, storm. snow and other changes in weather I feel more severe in leg than arm. yes**
- 12. What power of movement remains in the stump? *leg amputated above knee* shot in through knee joint and hip joint. stump is sound and strong
- 13. What artificial appliances have been tried? Dr Bly [?]. Wooden leg used [?] 3 now.
- 14. Which has been most satisfactory? my old bone & flesh leg
- 15. What inconveniences have attended the wearing of artificial appliances? *mainly* the belt and straps keeping leg in place
- 16. Can they be worn continuously (excepting at night)? yes, I have not been without leg except at night since July 1864 barring some very hot days, when I take off for convenience sake. I prespire [perspire] very easily
- 17. Give length and shape of stump. 19 inches natural shape
- 18. What alterations have taken place in its appearance since operation? of course not being used the muscles have decreased and the constant pressure of artificial leg reduces the stump in thickness
- 19. Are there any involuntary twitchings or spasmodic movements at the stump? **at times**
 - nervous twitchings caused sometimes by overexerting leg. walking standing too long or if I get the stump very cold [?] [?]
- 20. What is the character of such movements?
- 21. When were they first noted? ever since amputation
- 22. How often do they occur? *no regularity*
- 23. What causes them? *overexertion, colds*
- 24. Are they accompanied by pain? **yes, nervous twitching, causes sleeplessness**
- 25. Do you still feel the lost part? yes

- 26. If you do not feel it now, how long did you feel it after the amputation? **at first**more acute especialy [especially] in arm
- 27. How much of the limb do you feel now, and how does the feeling differ from what it would be if the member were present? *mainly the hand and fingers similar* sensation as holding a pretty hot iron
- 28. Does the limb feel as if shortened? same

Does it feel as if in one fixed position? yes

If not, does the apparent posture change from time to time? I can move my fingers apparently, but not clinch them to make a fist nor strengthen the fingers altogether. when I attempt these movements the muscles in stump move

Has this apparent position any relation to the position of the stump? **no**
